Squad Structure and Function

1. You will co-operate and comply with all reasonable directions given by the Canterbury Track Cycling Representative staff*
2. You will co-operate with all other members of the squad and every team of which you are a member
3. You will make every effort to be available for a team, if selected
4. You will undertake any physical or medical testing required by Canterbury Track Cycling

Professionalism

5. You will display control, courtesy, respect, honesty, dignity and professionalism
6. You will be punctual, have high standards of language, manner, preparation and presentation
7. You will refrain from drinking alcohol and taking of any recreational drugs
8. You will refrain from any form of verbal, physical or emotional abuse towards other riders, and Canterbury Track Cycling staff. If you see any form of abuse happening in the programme, you will report this immediately to Canterbury Track Cycling management.
9. You will not harass abuse or discriminate against riders, coaches or Canterbury Track Cycling staff on the basis of their gender, sexual orientation, religion, ethical beliefs, race, colour, ethnic origin, employment status, disability or any other distinguishing characteristics. if you see any form of discrimination happening in the programme, you will report this immediately to Canterbury Track Cycling management
10. You will wear any representative uniform or other apparel at all ceremonies and functions organised in connection with where the rider appears as a member of a Team. You must not modify or disfigure the uniform in any way.
11. You will behave in a manner befitting a representative sportsperson and so as not to bring yourself, Canterbury Track Cycling or CyclingNZ into disrepute

12. You will comply with the constitution, bylaws, rules, regulations, protocols, policies and procedures of Canterbury Centre, CyclingNZ, BRT and the UCI. If you have a complaint at any event with commissaries / officials, you will follow the following protocol:
 - a. Inform squad coaches or managers of any disputes
 - b. Let squad coaches or managers deal with disputes by allowing them to take control of the process
13. You will refrain from using your mobile phone during squad activities such as during team meetings, pre-race briefings and post-race briefings
14. You will respect facilities and equipment provided by Canterbury Track Cycling

You will be a positive role model for cycling

15. Canterbury Track Cycling may organise and arrange any media exposure on behalf of the Rider that Canterbury Track Cycling considers appropriate. You will, at the request of Canterbury Track Cycling, be available for any media comment or exposure arranged by Canterbury Track Cycling
16. **Social Media:** you will not comment on any selection, team or other Canterbury Track Cycling issues in such a way that negatively impacts yourself, Canterbury Track Cycling, other riders, or CyclingNZ. This includes all online forums, websites, Facebook, twitter, Instagram and ALL other public spaces.
17. You will comply with all rules, regulations, bylaws, policies and codes of conduct relating to drugs and doping. You will, at all times, comply with the UCI Antidoping Examination Regulations, CyclingNZ Antidoping Policies, the New Zealand Sports Drug Agency Act 1994 and all Regulations made under that Act.
18. You are to undergo any drug testing, gender testing or other testing that management requires. Canterbury Track Cycling will meet the costs associated with any tests required.
19. If you are found guilty of an offence connected with doping or the use or trafficking of drugs, Canterbury Track Cycling may, in addition to its other rights it may have, make public your name and the offence committed.

You accept that Canterbury Track Cycling will not be liable for

20. Any loss, damage or injury of any kind arising directly or indirectly from any act, neglect or fault (whether negligent or otherwise) on the part of Canterbury Track Cycling and connected with the Rider's participation at any Canterbury Track Cycling development camps or events, unless it arises as a direct result of a deliberate and wrongful act or omission by Canterbury Track Cycling.
21. Medical treatment conducted on the Rider, or any disciplinary or other action ordered or taken against the Rider by Canterbury Track Cycling

Consequences

22. if you breach any of the expectations listed above, Canterbury Track Cycling may:
 - a. suspend you from competition; and / or impose a penalty or sanction;
 - b. withdraw you from selection in representative squads
 - c. withdraw you from any official event
